## Agenda Items:

#### 1. CFGP Update - Mark Lombard

- a. Ministry for Forest regional director has agreed to come to the island to meet regarding issuing of the 1 Cutting Permit (1CP) and concerns about meeting our AAC
- **b.** 5 Year Plan, 2nd draft was presented in December to CFGP for review. Community presentation will be scheduled soon
- **c.** Harvest projections emphasise selective logging.
- **d.** CFGP is interested in developing Urban Wildland Interface (UWI) management strategies
- e. seeking funding and/or matching grants for enhanced silviculture projects in the CF landbase
- **f.** Larsens Meadow restocking survey will be undertaken this year.
- problems with Deer browsing Douglas Fir seedlings
- explore alternatives to polycarbonate cone protection (vexar) ii.
- iii. consider advantages of reusable wire cages
- need for a manager to coordinate volunteer effort
- **g.** Sliammon First Nation requests archeological surveys be conducted in management areas
