# Minutes of Board Meeting – June 5, 2017

# Agenda Items:

- 1. Minutes accepted from board meeting 2017/03/06. via email
- 2. Presentation by Mario to the board re Firewood. His points included the following:
  - a. cited CFOP pg 7 Governing Principles, that "CFGP recognises the need for a reliable supply of firewood to residents. CFGP will make firewood available in a variety of ways to satisfy demands for both private users and contractors."
  - **b.** estimates annual need to be approx 1000 cords
  - **c.** with reference to cost per cord, suggests that price may need to increase to \$350/cord in order to make firewood supply a viable product of CFGP operations,
  - **d.** recommends evaluating actual cost to produce firewood
  - **e.** suggested that there is a "social contract"/"obligation" to provide firewood to the community.
  - **f.** speaks on behalf of community members who have approached him with concerns about firewood, expressed disatisfaction with methods and volumes available from first 3 years of operations.
  - **g.** need for clear communications if volume of firewood available in 2017 will be less than previous years
  - **h.** independent contractor could produce firewood in a designated area by commercial thinning

### 3. Commentary from CCFC Board included the following:

- **a.** Firewood is a priority for the CCFC Board.
- **b.** Policy recommendations are currently being worked on
- **c. Firewood production statistics**: 2015 = 700 cords firewood produced, 2016 = 670 cords produced, 2017 = 40 cords produced. Very small harvest in spring 2017 results in less firewood available so far this year.
- **d.** Recognise need to inform the community of annual firewood supply amounts and potential for reduced volumes available in certain seasons.
- e. current cost of Douglas Fir Gang class logs are \$200/m3
- f. CFGP has substantially subsidized firewood supply through lost revenue,

- particularly due to high sale prices of Douglas Fir
- **g.** Recognise the need to educate the Cortes community about economic and practical limitations of firewood supply potentials.
- h. Need to educate about Heating Values of Firewood Species for reference, the following values are cited <u>from World Forest Industries</u> measured in Million BTU's per cord (MBTU)
- i. Douglas Fir = 26.5 MBTU (100%)
- ii. Hemlock = 24.4 MBTU (92%)
- **iii.** Red Alder = 19.5 MBTU (73%)
- i. undervalued species can be very good alternatives to Fir Multi purpose approaches will be more successful.
- j. Hemlock and Alder harvested from rehabilitation areas are more cost effective to harvest and of much lower \$ value compared to Douglas Fir.
- **k.** Methods used to produce lower cost firewood for independent contractors or off Cortes supply may not be appropriate for community forest operations.
- I. Alternate values restrain harvesting impact to minimum volume. No social licence to use Fir saw logs for firewood.
- **m.** Prioritize special community meeting on Firewood Policy in August. Focus on problem solving.
- **n.** Review wording in CFOP to reflect the full range of firewood goals and challenges.
- **4.** Board training opportunities offered by John Drew. Prioritize for after busy season.
- **5.** CCFC Board field trip to view proposed **operations area for fall 2017** *James Creek 1*. Scheduled Friday June 16, 4:30pm. Meet at yellow gate, Jimmy Smith Way
- 6. Community Meeting Profit Sharing Policy July 6
  - a. Follow up from 2017 AGM agenda item.
  - **b.** CCFC share of profits to date \$20 000 represents all the funds available
  - c. Priority uses identified in Draft Profit Disbursement Policy attached
  - d. Membership investment shares discussed
